

# INFORMATION NOTE ON THE PROCESSING OF YOUR DATA

Dear client,

At the end of April, we sent out a message (<u>Belgium</u> or <u>Luxembourg</u>) in which we explain how we are implementing the General Data Protection Regulation (**AVG** or **GDPR**) in our relationship with clients and how we deal with your personal data.

As part of our services as your insurance broker and risk consultant, we may also process your health or judicial data in addition to your name, address and any other personal data.

### a) The processing of your health data

Requesting the reimbursement of medical costs after a hospitalisation, mentioning your (temporary) work disability due to an accident at work or in your personal life, or the fact that you were injured during a car accident, these are only a few examples of situations where we process your health data for the servicing of your insurance contract.

In accordance with the GDPR, which is effective as of 25 May 2018, we now need your explicit consent to process such data.

We are counting on your cooperation so that the principles of the GDPR are respected and so that we can continue to guarantee you our services.

### b) The processing of your judicial data

Answering the question of whether you have been fined in the past for alcohol intoxication, submitting the police report after a car accident, , calling on a lawyer under your legal assistance insurance or, you are director of a company and you inform us that you are interrogated by the police or the public prosecutor. These are just a few examples of situations in which we process your judicial data for the servicing of your insurance contract.

In accordance with the GDPR, which is effective as of 25 May 2018, we provide explicit information about the legal grounds for processing of judicial data.
